These notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by the recipient, the City of Passaic.

REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

On or about Tuesday, April 13, 2021, the City of Passaic will submit a request to the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the release of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds under [24 CFR Part 58.35 (a)] of the name of the Act of 1974, as amended, to under a project known as the 100 steps, located at 481 Harrison St in Passaic, NJ for the purpose of reconstructing the 100 steps located at the Latona Griffin park and benefiting a low to moderate income area wide benefit within the City. Estimated funding from CDBG dollars is \$550,000.00.

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

The City of Passaic has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. Additional project information is contained in the Environmental Review Record (ERR) on file at the City of Passaic Department of Community Development and may be examined or copied weekdays 9:00 A.M. to 3:00 P.M.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Any individual, group, or agency may submit written comments on the ERR to the City of Passaic Department of Community Development. All comments received by Monday, April 12, 2021 will be considered by the City of Passaic prior to authorizing submission of a request for release of funds. Comments should specify which Notice they are addressing.

ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION

The City of Passaic certifies to HUD that Mayor Hector C. Lora in his capacity as Mayor of Passaic consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the recipient City of Passaic to use Program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

HUD will accept objections to its release of fund and the City of Passaic's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the City of Passaic; (b) the City of Passaic has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to the HUD office at U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, Newark Field Office, Region II, One Newark Center, 12 Floor, Newark, New Jersey, 07102-5260. Potential objectors should contact HUD to verify the actual last day of the objection period.

**Statewide Distracted Driving
Enforcement and Awareness Campaign
UDrive. UText. UPay.
to be carried out locally from
April 1 – April 30, 2021**

Borough of Woodland Park -- Law enforcement officers from the Woodland Park Police Department will be cracking down on distracted drivers during April as part of New Jersey's UDrive, UText, UPay, enforcement campaign.

Beginning April 1 and running through the end of the month this high visibility law enforcement initiative will target motorists who engage in dangerous distracted driving behaviors such as talking on hand-held cell phones and sending text messages while driving.

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration reports that in 2018 alone, 2,841 people were killed in distracted driving crashes on our nation's roads and an estimated 400,000 people injured. In New Jersey, driver inattention was listed as a contributing factor in crashes at a rate seven times higher than that of speed, the next highest factor.

Distracted driving is any activity that diverts attention from driving, including talking or texting on your phone, eating and drinking, talking to people in your vehicle, adjusting the stereo, entertainment or navigation system – anything that takes your attention away from the task of safe driving. Texting is the most alarming distraction. Sending or reading a text takes your eyes off the road for five seconds. At 55 MPH, that's like driving the length of an entire football field with your eyes closed.

New Jersey is one of eight states nationally to receive dedicated federal funds this year to address the issue of distracted driving. This federal funding will be used for police overtime enforcement grants at the local level as well as a state wide multimedia public awareness campaign.

The campaign is being carried out during the month of April, which the National Safety Council has designated as Distracted Driving Awareness Month. For additional information regarding this campaign.
